Voter Eligibility: You are eligible to register to vote if you are a U.S. citizen, age 18 or older, and a legal resident of the county in which you want to register.

Florida's Closed Primary Elections: Although party affiliation is not a registration requirement, only voters registered with a political party can vote in that party's primary elections. All eligible voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote in nonpartisan contests, and universal primary elections in which all candidates for an office have the same party affiliation, if the winner of the primary will have no opposition in the general election. Where to Vote: You can vote at the polling place in your precinct on Election Day, by mail, or during early voting (when available). Check VotePinellas.com or your voter information card for your districts and the polling place in your precinct.

Government in the Sunshine: The Florida Sunshine Law requires that all meetings at which decisions about public business are made, including those of the Florida Legislature, be open to the public. The Florida Open Records Law requires that the files of all public agencies be open for public inspection.
