Supervisor of Elections Mails Domestic Ballots For St. Petersburg Primary Election

Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections Deborah Clark mailed **6,182** ballots today (July 21) to domestic voters residing in District 7 for the August 25 St. Petersburg Primary Election.

Domestic voters are civilian voters residing within the United States and active-duty military voters residing in Pinellas County.

Pursuant to the City of St. Petersburg Municipal Charter, Council Member races in the Primary are voted on by single-member district. Only voters registered in District 7 are eligible to vote in this election.

Additional mail ballot requests will be fulfilled daily as received. To request a mail ballot, visit VotePinellas.com, call (727) 464-VOTE (8683) or email Absentee@VotePinellas.com. The deadline to request that a ballot be mailed is 5:00 p.m. on August 19.

Voted mail ballots must be received at one of the three Supervisor of Elections Offices by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Please note, postal delivery service has changed. Voters are advised to allow at least 5 days for their ballot to be returned by mail to the Supervisor of Elections Office.

Mail ballots may also be dropped off at one of the three Supervisor of Elections Offices (open Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.). Voted mail ballots cannot be accepted at polling places.

Daily ballot requests, ballot mailing updates and statistics on voted ballots received by the Supervisor of Elections are posted to VotePinellas.com.
