Last-Minute Reminders for March 15 Presidential Preference Primary and Municipal Elections

The Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections Office encourages registered voters in the March 15 Presidential Preference Primary and Municipal Elections to remember the following information:

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE:

- Voters must be registered with the Republican Party or Democrat Party to vote in their respective party's Primary for President. Florida is a closed primary state.
- Registered voters residing in the 11 municipalities also conducting elections Town of Belleair, City of Clearwater, City of Gulfport, City of Indian Rocks Beach, City of Madeira Beach, City of Oldsmar, City of Pinellas Park, City of South Pasadena, City of St. Pete Beach, City of Tarpon Springs and City of Treasure Island (District 4) – may vote in their nonpartisan municipal elections (St. Pete Beach and Treasure Island vote by single-member districts).
- The deadline to register to vote and change political party affiliation was February 16, 2016.

WHEN:

• Polling places will be open 7:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

WHERE:

- State law requires voters to vote in the **precinct in which they reside.** Voters who have moved are required to vote in their **new** home precinct.
- Voters are encouraged to confirm their polling places by visiting <u>VotePinellas.com</u> and clicking on the "Find Your Precinct" button at the top of the page, or calling (727) 464-VOTE (8683).

HOW:

- Voters should bring <u>photo and signature identification</u> to the polls to avoid delays. Anyone without valid
 and current ID may vote a provisional ballot. The canvassing board will later determine the validity of
 any provisional ballots.
- Voters are encouraged to make any address changes prior to Election Day online at <u>VotePinellas.com</u>; by calling (727) 464-VOTE (8683); or emailing <u>Election@VotePinellas.com</u> (include birth date).
- Name changes may be made by sending a signed, written statement to the Supervisor of Elections (13001 Starkey Rd., Largo, FL 33773); include birth date or voter ID number.
- It is important for voters to have their current signature on file and to remain consistent when using their legal signature – in order for the signature on their mail ballot return envelope to be verified.

EARLY VOTING

 Early Voting continues through Sunday, March 13 in all three Elections Offices: Monday-Friday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.; Saturday-Sunday, 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Check Early Voting wait times at VotePinellas.com

MAIL BALLOTS:

- Any voter may request a mail ballot. The deadline to request a ballot to be mailed is 5:00 p.m.,
 Wednesday, March 9.
- Beginning Thursday, March 10, voters may designate in writing a person to pick up their ballot; however, the designee may not pick up more than two mail ballots per election in addition to the designee's own ballot or a ballot for an immediate family member.
- Mail ballots may still be picked up or voted in person at any Elections Office through Monday, March 14.
- Florida state law provides that mail ballot pickup and voting in Supervisor of Elections Offices on Election
 Day is <u>only</u> permitted in the case of an emergency. A voter or voter's designee must sign an affidavit
 affirming that the voter is unable to go to his/her polling place on Election Day due to an emergency and
 provide the reason for the emergency.
- Ballots must be received by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day (March 15) at any one of the three Supervisor of
 Elections Offices. Voted mail ballots can be dropped off at any of the three Elections Offices. Mail ballots
 cannot be accepted at a polling place on Election Day.
- Remote ballot drop-off locations are available through Monday, March 14 and will be <u>closed</u> on Election
 Day. Check for locations and hours at <u>VotePinellas.com</u> or in mail ballot kit instructions.
- <u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> Postal delivery service has changed. Voters are advised to allow at least
 5 days for their ballot to be returned by mail to the Supervisor of Elections Office.

OTHER INFORMATION:

- No political activity or campaign signs are allowed inside the polling place or within 100 feet of the
 polling place entrance or elections office entrance. Exit polling is permitted in designated areas as voters
 are leaving the polls.
- No photography is allowed inside the polling place.
