Supervisor of Elections Mails Domestic Ballots For St. Petersburg Primary Election

The Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections mailed **64,581** ballots today (July 25) to domestic voters residing in the City of St. Petersburg for the August 29 Primary Election:

- All eligible registered voters can request a mail ballot and vote in the comfort of their homes
- Voted mail ballots must be received at one of the three Elections Offices by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day
- <u>Voters are advised to allow at least ONE WEEK for their ballot to be returned by mail to the</u> <u>Supervisor of Elections Office</u>
- Voted mail ballots cannot be accepted at polling places

Pursuant to the City of St. Petersburg Municipal Charter, Council Member contests in the Primary are voted on by single-member district while the Mayoral contest is voted on at-large.

Domestic voters are civilian voters residing within the United States and active-duty military voters residing in Pinellas County.
