Supervisor of Elections Mails Domestic Ballots For May 2 St. Petersburg Special Election Referendum

The Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections mailed 67,222 ballots today (March 28) to domestic voters residing in the City of St. Petersburg for the May 2 St. Petersburg Special Election Referendum.

- All eligible registered voters can request a mail ballot and vote in the comfort of their homes
- Voted mail ballots must be received at one of the three Elections Offices by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day
- Please note, postal delivery service changed. Voters are advised to allow at least ONE WEEK for their ballot to be returned by mail to the **Supervisor of Elections Office.**
- Mail ballots may be dropped off at one of the three **Supervisor of Elections Offices**
- Voted mail ballots cannot be accepted at polling places



Domestic voters are civilian voters residing within the United States and active-duty military voters residing in Pinellas County.
