### **Wednesday, March 7 is Deadline for Voters to Request a Ballot to be Mailed for March 13 Municipal Elections**

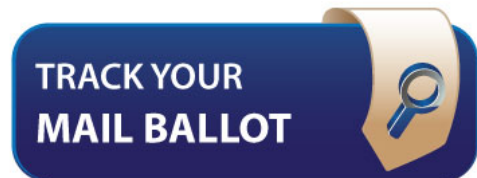
The Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections reminds voters that **5:00 p.m. Wednesday, March 7** is the deadline to request a ballot to be mailed for the March 13, 2018 Municipal Elections.

All eligible registered voters can request a mail ballot and vote in the comfort of their homes. To request a mail ballot, visit [VotePinellas.com](http://VotePinellas.com), call (727) 464-VOTE (8683) or email [MailBallot@VotePinellas.com](mailto:MailBallot@VotePinellas.com). Ballots may also be picked up in Supervisor of Elections Offices; however, mail ballot pickup and voting in Elections Offices on Election Day is only permitted in the case of an emergency.

**Please note, voters are advised to allow at least ONE WEEK for their ballot to be returned by mail to the Supervisor of Elections Office.** Voted mail ballots can also be dropped off at any of the three Elections Offices, including on Election Day.

All ballots must be **received** at an Elections Office by **7:00 p.m. on Election Day**. All accepted mail ballots are included in election results.
