* For nonpartisan contests, if no candidate wins the majority of the vote in the contest (50% plus one vote), the two candidates receiving the most votes will be in a runoff on the November 6 General Election ballot.

** The State Representative District 70 contest is a "Universal Primary Contest" because all qualified candidates are registered with the same political party. All registered voters in State House District 70 are eligible to vote in this contest. The candidate receiving the most votes in this contest will be the winner, and this contest will not appear on the November 6 General Election ballot.

Voted mail ballots must be received at one of the three Supervisor of Elections Offices by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Mail ballots may be dropped off at any of the three Supervisor of Elections Offices. Mail ballots may also be dropped off at one of 12 remote ballot drop-off sites throughout Pinellas County through August 27. Check VotePinellas.com for hours and locations. Voted mail ballots cannot be accepted at polling places.
